Brockenborough Rotary Health Park Community Garden

Rules

- Garden is open seasonally (April – October) from 6am – 10 pm, for renters only.
- Gardeners are responsible for securing gates when they exit with keys provided. Lost or stolen keys must be reported immediately to Parks and Recreation. A replacement key will cost \$10.
- Taking things from garden plots other than your own is considered theft. Report any suspicious or illegal activity in the Garden to the Parks and Recreation Department or contact the Paducah Police Dept at 270-444-8550.
- Pets are not allowed in the garden area.
- Family members are welcome to the garden site. Please supervise young children so they do not disturb other plots.
- Do not climb on the garden walls or on the fences.
- Gardeners are responsible for providing their own seeds, plants, tools, hoses, etc for planting and the general upkeep of their own plot.
- Planting trees and other invasive species are not permitted to be planted in the garden.
- Tall crops such as sunflowers, corn, and trellised plants may be grown but may not shade other plots.
- Perennial plants are prohibited in the community garden.
- Water is available on site for use. Sprinklers are prohibited. Hand watering only. Please conserve water. Please be sure water is turned off when not in use.
- Herbicides (weed killers), insecticides, chemical fertilizers, animal poisons and non-organic materials (including treated wood) are prohibited.
- Plastic mulch or rubber mulch is not permitted.
- Individual garden plots are to be used for growing vegetables and flowers for family use. Growing for commercial sale must be pre-approved by Parks and Recreation. Other Rules apply.
- Dispose of weeds and garden waste in designated composting areas only.
- Outside food is not permitted for composting or use as mulch.
- Dispose of trash in the appropriate trash receptacles.
- Dispose of any personal items by the end of the gardening season (October 31)
- Parks will maintain the center garden circle and shrubs along the perimeter fence. These are additions to the garden for proper pollination.
