



City Commission Meeting Highlights

Agreement with Marcum Engineering Regarding Dome Relocation Project

The Paducah Board of Commissioners approved an ordinance for an agreement with Marcum Engineering, LLC for engineering services in an amount not to exceed \$65,500 associated with the relocation of the dome pavilion. Due to the construction of the Holiday Inn Paducah Riverfront, the dome is being moved from its previous location at 600 North 4th Street to a nearly five-acre lot at 619 North 6th Street.

Quick Highlights

- Municipal order approved to apply for the Kentucky League of Cities Insurance Services Safety Grant. This grant requires a 50 percent match. The City is requesting \$2555.45 which would require an equal match. If awarded, the funds would be used to purchase an ADA compliant swing at Noble Park.
- Municipal order approved authorizing the acquisition of the property at 427 North 6th Street for \$1. A separate municipal order was approved declaring the property as surplus and authorizing the transfer to the best evaluated bidder. The property was advertised in October with one bid received with a proposal by William and Vickie Robertson to purchase the lot for \$100. The couple plans to build a 1400 square foot home.
- Ordinance approved (vote Nov. 10) to accept the Renaissance on Main grant award in the amount of \$5000. The grant funds will be for the installation of four bike racks in the downtown historic district. The artistic racks will be installed at 2nd and Broadway, in two locations in Market Square, and by the downtown restrooms.
- The contractor working on the demolition of 432 Broadway will be back on site Monday to begin the temporary shoring of the adjacent building. This work will be done under the existing demolition contract. Permanent shoring of the adjacent building, which will require a contract amendment, will be necessary following the demolition of 432 Broadway.
- The closing of the loan for the Holiday Inn Paducah Riverfront will occur tomorrow morning at City Hall. Representatives from LinGate Hospitality, Independence Bank, and the City of Paducah will sign the closing documents. City Manager Jeff Pederson says this is a "huge milestone" that represents finality of the project to bring a hotel to downtown Paducah adjacent to the convention centers.

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
